



INTRODUCTION TO 2016-2040 COLUMBUS AREA METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN

As the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the metropolitan Columbus area, the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) conducts a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process. Every 4 years, the results of the process produce a Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) that looks at least 20 years into the future.

As our region continues to grow and funding availability becomes more limited, Central Ohio must be prepared with innovative transportation solutions to address increasing infrastructure needs. The MTP is a long-range planning document that brings together local governments from around Central Ohio and other local, state, and federal agencies to identify and coordinate transportation goals and policies over the next two decades.

The MTP will identify transportation needs, strategies and projects, and provide the basis for how federal transportation funding will be spent to improve highways, transit, freight, bikeways, and pedestrian facilities.

The current MTP planning area includes: Franklin and Delaware Counties, the City of Pataskala and Etna Township in Licking County, and the townships of Violet and Bloom in Fairfield County.



Planning for the 2016-2040 MTP is guided by federal legislation, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21). The federal legislation sets a framework for the MTP to:

- Reflect a balance between regulations and state and local plans
- Involve a comprehensive, coordinated, continuous planning process
- Be performance-driven, outcome-based
- Consider all modes of transportation
- Address environmental mitigation
- Result in a fiscally balanced plan
- Meet air quality conformity
- Avoid negatively impacting transportation-disadvantaged populations
- Be accomplished through an open and transparent public process

PROPOSED GOALS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN

The MTP will be developed around a set of goals that give direction to making regionally based investments in the transportation system. The six goals being proposed are listed here. Objectives and measurements will also be developed to monitor the performance of the transportation system in achieving these goals.

Through transportation:

- Reduce per capita energy consumption and promote alternative fuel resources to increase affordability and resilience of regional energy supplies
- Protect natural resources and mitigate infrastructure vulnerabilities to maintain a healthy ecosystem and community
- Position Central Ohio to attract and retain economic opportunity to prosper as a region and compete globally
- Create sustainable neighborhoods to improve residents' quality of life
- Increase regional collaboration and employ innovative transportation solutions to maximize the return on public expenditures
- Use public investments to benefit the health, safety, and welfare of people
