Issue: People

Metric: Election Participation

The right to vote is the one of the most fundamental components of democracy. The chart below shows election participation (voter turnout) in central Ohio for presidential and midterm general elections between 2000 and 2008. From the 2000 and 2008 presidential elections, voter turnout increased in 11 of the 12 counties, and participation in the region as a whole was 8.9% higher. However, voter turnout in central Ohio has been consistently lower than statewide and nationwide turnout.
