Metric: Bicycle and Pedestrian Crashes

The chart below shows the total number of crashes involving a vehicle and a bicyclist or pedestrian (including skaters and other non-motorized forms of transportation) in each county in central Ohio from 2003 to 2009. Once population is taken into account, the counties with the highest bicycle and pedestrian crash rates are Marion, Franklin, and Fayette. Between 2008 and 2009, Knox County has had the greatest reduction (15%) in crashes per person out of all counties in central Ohio.
