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# MID-OHIO REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION BYLAWS

### SMART REGION TASK FORCE

### A. NAME

The name of this committee shall be Smart Region Task Force and will be housed within the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission.

### B. ORIGIN

The Smart Region Task Force is a short-term, ad-hoc MORPC member-focused committee to evaluate and advise the COMMISSION on matters of regional importance pertaining to technological advancements and policy opportunities that will foster the creation of a smart region. It may address topics such as smart mobility, smart streets policies, thoroughfare planning, electric vehicle accommodations, mobility as a service, autonomous and connected vehicles, creating data-enabled infrastructure, and smart corridor coordination.

### C. PURPOSE

The Smart Region Task Force's primary purpose is to prepare and guide local governments and stakeholders with diverse needs and interests on smart infrastructure investments. This work is accomplished by collaboratively creating regional policies and guidelines intended to fully leverage the opportunity for technological advancement and sustained vitality in the Central Ohio region. To do so, the Task Force generates deliverables that leverage technology to help Central Ohio communities better achieve the regional goals as outlined in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, Regional Sustainability Agenda, and other plans as appropriate. The Smart Region Task Force will research best practices and policies and provide deliverables and recommendations to the Commission as guided by the annual goals and as determined by the Committee. The deliverables shall be consistent with other MORPC adopted strategic plans, its Regional Policy Agenda, and sustainability agreements. The COMMISSION, MORPC staff, and local communities will utilize the deliverables when making smart infrastructure investments around the region in an integrated manner. As deliverables are determined and realized, MORPC staff will support local communities in smart planning and implementation processes.

## D. QUORUM

A quorum shall be defined as those members present and eligible to vote at any meeting. An affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum is necessary for any action taken.

### E. MEMBERSHIP

Membership shall be nominated by the Executive Director or the Committee Chair. Members are expected to serve on the Committee throughout the duration of its existence, anticipated to be 18-24 months.

Representation on the Smart Region Task Force shall include at least 12 members. All members shall be located within the MORPC Region. Due consideration shall be given to the make-up of the Committee to ensure no one entity is over-represented on the Committee. The Smart Region Task Force composition shall consist of the following:

- 1. A Chair and Vice Chair from COMMISSION.
- 2. Two-thirds representation from Central Ohio communities who are MORPC members.
- 3. Other representation from Central Ohio thought-leaders who can advise the Committee.
- 4. Ex-Officio members as needed.

Under the guidance of the Executive Director and Committee Chair the Smart Region Task Force shall adopt guidelines to establish the size limit of the Committee, and provisions to encourage diverse involvement in subcommittee membership and leadership.

### F. OFFICERS

The chair of the Smart Region Task Force must be a full member representative of the COMMISSION and is selected and documented by the COMMISSION Chair and Executive Director. He/she will serve at the pleasure of the COMMISSION Chair and Executive Director.

The Vice Chair of the Smart Region Task Force is selected by the COMMISSION Chair and Executive Director. He/she will serve at the pleasure of the COMMISSION Chair and Executive Director.

### G. SUBCOMMITTEES

The Smart Region Task Force is advised by standing subcommittees or working groups as established by the Committee Chair and Executive Director to address key regional smart cities issues.

The Smart Region Task Force may adopt bylaws to govern the subcommittees, the selection process of subcommittee members, and establish provisions to encourage broad involvement in subcommittee membership and leadership.

### H. MEETINGS

The Smart Region Task Force will meet as necessary.

**Background:** Central Ohio is recognized nationally as a hotbed for smart technology and mobility innovation. The Smart Region Task force is a member-focused committee created to advance and leverage "smart mobility" and data-enabled infrastructure initiatives throughout the region, including Smart Columbus, the US 33 Smart Corridor, and the Intelligent Communities Forum. The task force will convene thought leaders within Central Ohio to define what it means for the region to be a "Smart Region" and work to encourage and empower all communities in the region to advance proven approaches and best practices within their planning activities and infrastructure investment.

Situation/Problem/Opportunity: Leaders of Central Ohio communities recognize technological advancements around transportation and data enabled infrastructure will dramatically disrupt the status quo of current local government planning processes in the coming years. Community leaders view this market disruption as an opportunity to thoughtfully plan for future growth and investment in a manner that fully leverages these new technologies to solve infrastructure challenges and promote economic vibrancy throughout the region. As a forward-looking region, leadership understands that embracing smart technology ensures that the Central Ohio region keeps pace in an increasingly competitive globalized world. The formation of a Smart Region Task Force will provide for information sharing, coordination, and planning to ensure a successful implementation of the Smart Region vision.
