Supports SWACO's mission to divert materials from the landfill



Emphasizes support for projects that create partnership building and collaboration



Addresses opportunities to leverage the waste stream for community benefit



Invests in innovative and sustainable diversion programs




- Grants are competitively awarded
- Open to all cities, townships, and villages, schools, universities, and colleges, governmental entities, and non-profit organizations
- The minimum grant amount \$500
- The maximum \$35,000
- A twenty-five percent (25%) cash contribution is required

2020 Financial Contributions








CWRG Applicant Eligibility

- Grant related activities must occur in 2022.
- Eligible applicants include government entities, schools, parks, and non-profits.
- Activities must take place within SWACO's jurisdiction, which is comprised of Franklin County and includes Canal Winchester, Dublin, New Albany, Reynoldsburg, and Westerville.





Grant Highlights

- Offers up to \$2,000 for implementation on-theground conservation projects
- 3 grants (or equivalent) awarded annually
- Franklin Soil and Water's Conservation Fund is a pool of funds originating from donations and events including the Annual Meeting and Tree Sale





Eligibility and Application Process

- Franklin County, Ohio non-profit organizations such as schools, watershed groups, municipalities, community groups, including governing bodies and associations such as HOAs and condo associations, and civic associations
- Applications accepted annually (Jan-Feb)

 Competitive grant. Applicants score based on their project's relative strength and adherence to "Ranking & Criteria" metrics



Ranking and Criteria

- Environmental Impact
- Connection to SWCD Mission
- Visibility
- Cost Efficiency





Project Examples

Examples of Eligible Projects

- Rainwater storage/harvesting with rain barrels/cisterns
- Reducing or slowing stormwater runoff by planting rain gardens or buffer zones
- Green infrastructure with blue or green roofs, underground detention, and pervious surfaces
- Landscaping and gardening with native trees and plants
- Invasive species removal
- Habitat improvement, such as litter collection, addition of wildlife shelter(s), bird houses, or pollinator sites
- Soil improvements such as the addition of compost, green manures, or cover crops
