



Neighborhood Revitalization Program

- Comprehensive quality-of-life improvements via constructing or rehabilitating facilities in targeted distress areas
- Low- and moderate-income (LMI) benefit
- Significant public participation
 element
- Must include three eligible activities



Economic Development and Public Infrastructure



Economic Development Loan

51% of jobs available to LMI individuals
Borrowers provide 5% cash equity of total fixed asset cost
15% of total fixed asset cost privately financed



Public Infrastructure Grant

51% of jobs available to LMI individuals Up to 50% of total offsite infrastructure costs Businesses must commit to onsite private investment



Economic Development and Public Infrastructure



Working Capital Loan

Promote job retention and expansion

51% of jobs retained or created must be LMI individuals

May cover payroll costs and monthly expenses, including payments on rent, mortgage, utilities, inventory, and other recurring expenses

Non-forgivable loan with a maximum 5-year term

Principal and interest payments may be deferred for six months with option to renew for six months

Open Cycle Programs

Residential Public Infrastructure

- Water and sewer systems for low-income communities
- Must serve primarily residential areas

Critical Infrastructure

- Significant community-wide impact
- Projects not eligible for Residential Public Infrastructure may apply



Historic Preservation Tax Credit Program


Helps preserve unique character of Ohio's communities and their historic buildings

- Buildings on the National Register of Historic Places; Certified Local Government historic district; listed as a local landmark by a Certified Local Government.
- State tax credit up to 25 percent of qualified rehabilitation expenditures incurred during a rehabilitation projects.
- Preserves historic buildings

Creates jobs:

- Construction
- New Businesses






How are grants distributed at The Columbus Foundation?



The following percentages reflect a typical year of grantmaking.


The Columbus Foundation grants described here are determined through the competitive application process.
