### Aging

Columbus City Council unanimously passed ordinances 1288-2017 and 1287-2017, both of which were initiated by Councilmember Michael Stinziano, to support the operation of two senior service organizations participating in the nationally recognized Village Movement.

South Columbus-based Village Connections and Clintonville-Beechwold Community Resources Center, Village in the Ville programs will both benefit from \$10,000 of grant funding to assist 50 and older residents to remain in their homes and as active citizens in The City of Columbus.

A significant number of the state's nursing homes are performing poorly on quality measures, according to a new report from Miami University and data from the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM). The report from Miami's Scripps Gerontology Center (SGC) says Ohio ranks below the national average on all 10 quality indicators measured by the U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Minimum Data Set (MDS). This is despite the fact that the ODM pays nursing facilities an amount that is in line with the national average, the Governor's Office of Health Transformation said in a document accompanying the data set from the state.

The House Aging and Long-Term Care Committee used its meeting to hear presentations from groups with its same focus -- the Ohio Association of Area Agencies on Aging (O4A), Ohio Council for Home Care and Hospice (OCHC) and LeadingAge Ohio.

### **Ballot Issues**

The campaign team supporting the Ohio Drug Price Relief Act was announced and will include a former Ohio Republican Party chairman and one of the top Republican media consultants in the country. Calling itself a "bipartisan political dream team," Ohio Taxpayers for Lower Drug Prices will support the Ohio Drug Price Relief Act, an initiated statute which would restrict what the state pays for pharmaceuticals to what the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs pays for the same drugs.

The Ohio Attorney General's Office certified the petition for a proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that would change the process for congressional redistricting in Ohio, saying supporters had both the necessary 1,000 valid signatures from registered Ohio voters and a "fair and truthful" summary of the proposed amendment. Earlier in May, the Fair Congressional Districts for Ohio campaign had resubmitted the "Bipartisan Congressional Redistricting Reform Amendment" constitutional amendment for review.

The opposition group to a proposed law that would prohibit Ohio from paying more for prescription drugs than the lowest price the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs pays for the same drug launched with a list of more than 30 organizations opposing the Drug Price Relief Act including three former Ohio Medicaid directors.

### FY18-19 Budget

On Tuesday, the Office of Budget and Management (OBM) released its preliminary figures for May, reporting that revenues continued to come in under estimates. Revenues fell \$67.0 million short for the month although officials said they continue to expect the state to finish the year in the black. This brings the year's shortfall to nearly \$840.8 million with one month left in FY17.

State Budget Director Tim Keen forecast continued savings over his office's proposed operating budget for FY18-19, sustaining the trend of revised spending estimates now 11 percent below agency appropriations for FY17. Members of the Senate Finance General Government and Agency Review Subcommittee were more interested in Keen's larger revenue projections, however, and their impact on the state's next biennium. OBM's total budget request for FY18, \$29.1 million (including General Revenue Funds and non-GRF), is slightly less than FY17's, while its request for FY19, \$29.9 million, is slightly more. Yet Keen said OBM is on track to spend only \$26.2 million of its \$29.5 million appropriation for the current fiscal year and can be expected to take the same approach in the new biennium.

Sen. Scott Oelslager (R-Canton), chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, released the committee's hearing schedule as it moves into the final weeks before the full chamber votes on HB49 (R. Smith), the FY18-19 budget bill. That vote, according to Senate President Larry Obhof (R-Medina), is expected around Wednesday, June 21.

The chairs and vice chairs of the four Senate Finance subcommittees presented an outline of the hundreds of witnesses they heard from over the last few weeks, with the Democratic vice chairs previewing amendments they plan to present as the budget moves through the Senate. The four chairs gave an overview of the issues raised during their subcommittee hearings, while Democrats discussed priorities and issues that they plan to address based on what they heard from testimony.

### **Elections**

Rep. Kathleen Clyde (D-Kent) became the first Democrat in the 2018 secretary of state's race, saying Ohio can and must encourage participation in elections and strengthen democracy.

U.S. Rep. Pat Tiberi (R-Columbus) said that he won't run for U.S. Senate in 2018, giving Treasurer Josh Mandel a clearer path to have a rematch against U.S. Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH), who defeated him in 2012.

Less than 24 hours after Kathleen Clyde joined the 2018 secretary of state's race, Sen. Frank LaRose (R-Copley) officially threw his hat into the ring, setting up a primary on the Republican side against Rep. Dorothy Pelanda (Marysville).

Steve Dettelbach, former U.S. attorney for the Northern District of Ohio, officially entered the 2018 attorney general's race with the announcement that he will "continue to fight for the people of Ohio" after spending 20 years as a prosecutor. Dettelbach has been laying the groundwork for the run for months, traveling the state and speaking at Democratic functions. He is the first Democrat in the race.

Cleveland investment banker Mike Gibbons announced that he will seek the Republican nomination for U.S. Senate next year, setting up a primary with Ohio Treasurer Josh Mandel. Gibbons, a partner with Brown Gibbons Lang & Company, noted his experience as a businessman in his announcement, and also took aim at the current incumbent of the seat, U.S. Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH).

### Employment/Unemployment

The national unemployment rate was 4.4 percent in April, according to data released by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), down from 4.5 percent in March, as total nonfarm payroll jobs increased by 211,000 nationally. According to BLS, the civilian labor force was 160 million in April, slightly higher than in March. The participation rate dropped slightly to 62.9 percent. The number of long-term unemployed, or those unemployed for 27 weeks or longer, fell slightly to 1.63 million. The number of discouraged workers, or those who gave up looking for work

because they didn't think they could find a job, fell to 455,000.

Ohio's unemployment rate was 5.0 percent in April, the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) said, down from 5.1 percent in March and unchanged from April 2016. ODJFS said Ohio's nonagricultural wage and salary employment decreased by 5,700 over the month, from a revised 5,518,500 in March to 5,512,800 in April 2017. The number of workers unemployed in Ohio in April was 288,000, down 5,000 from 293,000 in March. The number of unemployed has increased by 5,000 in the past 12 months from 283,000, ODJFS said.

### Energy

The Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) has adopted final wind farm rules based on legislation passed nearly three years ago in the 130th General Assembly. New administrative codes for mid-biennium review (MBR) proposals in 130-HB483 (Amstutz) now instruct applicants to avoid "unreasonable" shadow flicker at occupied buildings within 1,000 feet of any wind turbine, among other changes. Amendments approved by OPSB require an ice throw analysis; an assessment of navigable airspace, visual impact, shadow flicker, and state and federally listed animal species; a vegetation management plan; a post-construction avian and bat monitoring plan; and a written waiver of minimum setbacks by adjacent property owners, where applicable.

The state could miss out on 13,000 jobs and more than \$4.2 billion in local economic activity if Ohio's wind turbine setback law isn't revised, according to a new report from the American Wind Energy Association (AWEA). Ohio's setback law was changed from approximately 550 feet to about 1,300 feet after the enactment of 130-HB483 (Amstutz). During a Statehouse press conference releasing the report, industry representatives and local business development officials decried the policy, which they said was one of the most restrictive in the country.

### **Environment**

The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) will hold two public hearings on Friday, June 16, to accept public comments on the draft 2018 Program Management Plan for the Drinking Water Assistance Fund (DWAF). The fund provides financial and technical assistance for a variety of projects that help improve or protect the quality of Ohio's drinking water.

Local health departments and public entities will receive nearly \$1 million to address mosquito-borne viruses, Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Director Craig Butler and Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Acting Director Lance Himes announced.

### General Assembly/Statehouse

Ohio House Democratic Leader Fred Strahorn (D-Dayton) announced the start of a process to fill the vacancy in the 20th House District seat. The position was recently vacated by Heather Bishoff of Blacklick who resigned in order to pursue her financial planning business full-time and focus on her family.

Rep. Dorothy Pelanda (R-Marysville) announced that she is stepping down from her leadership position as majority floor leader and is being replaced by Rep. Bill Seitz (R-Cincinnati). Pelanda said she made the decision so she can focus on her campaign for secretary of state in 2018.

### Local Government

The state needs to repair its relationship with municipalities after years of shifting the tax burden to local governments,

Democratic city leaders said. Columbus City Council President Zach Klein, Dayton Mayor Nan Whaley and Lorain Mayor Chase Ritenauer joined a panel to discuss cuts to the Local Government Fund (LGF) and other issues during the Ohio Senate Democratic Caucus Budget Forum at the Statehouse.

#### Natural Resources

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) prohibited Rover Pipeline LLC from engaging in new horizontal directional drilling (HDD) operations following the recent release of millions of gallons of drilling fluid into Ohio wetlands. FERC is also ordering the pipeline, owned by Energy Transfer Partners, to hire a third-party contractor to assess Rover's actions and help the company plan to move forward without allowing the same level of negative environmental effects. New drilling will not be able to resume until the commission is satisfied.

### **Transportation**

The Controlling Board approved an Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) request for \$7 million to develop construction contract plans on the variable use of shoulders on I-670 between Fourth Street and I-270, despite questions and an opposing vote from Sen. Charleta Tavares (D-Columbus).

The Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) will hold six stakeholder meetings throughout the state regarding the development and adoption of administrative rules including fees, among other topics, as required by recently enacted transportation/public safety budget, HB26 (McColley).

Several states have recently passed transportation funding measures that include gas tax increases along with provisions intended to support infrastructure investment long-term, according to Sean Slone, director of transportation and infrastructure policy at the Council of State Governments (CSG). Slone offered a presentation on transportation funding options to the Senate Ways and Means Committee. Ohio's motor fuel tax has been set at 28 cents since 2005, according to the Ohio Department of Taxation.
