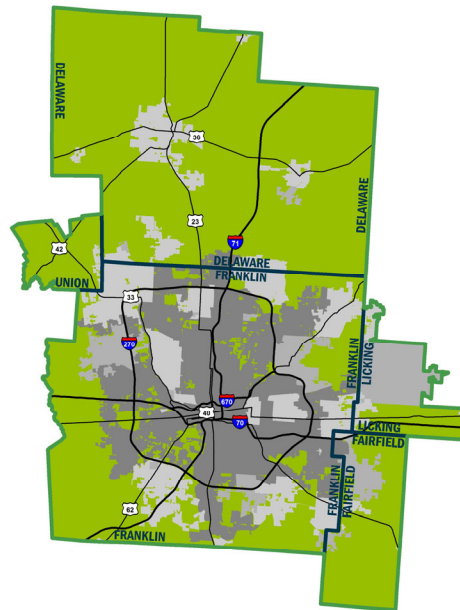

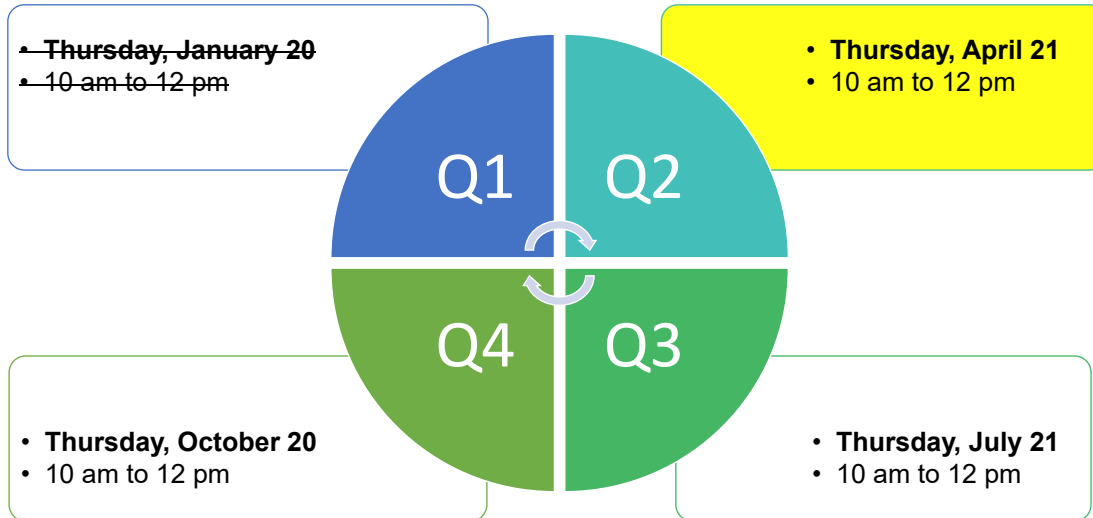

GOALS:
