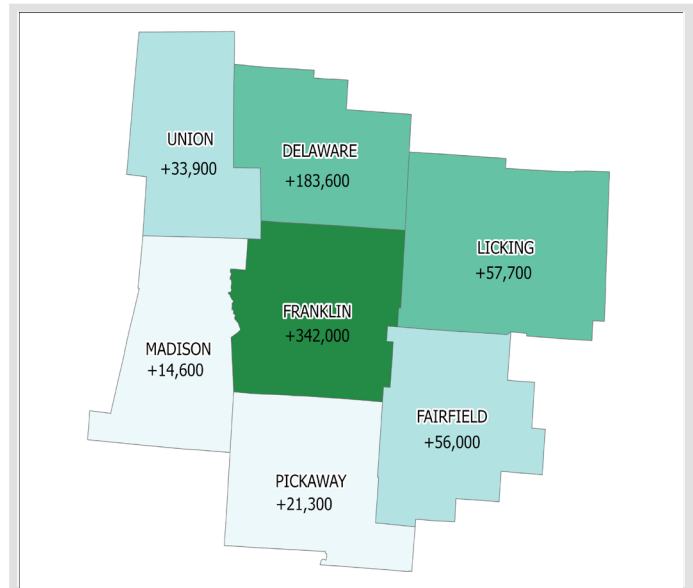

Core Issues → Priority Actions

- Increased Competition for Homes → Adopt “Green Tape“ Development Review
- Limited Supply of Homes Priced for Low-Income Households → Create a Housing Tax Credit
- Barriers Limiting Access to Homes → Enact Source-of-Income Protection Laws
- Demand for More Diverse Housing Stock → Pilot Diverse Lower-Cost Housing Products
- Housing Instability Among Central Ohio → Tenant-Based Rental Assistance

Barriers to Development

- Uncertainty associated with local land use processes and standards
- Higher costs of residential development
- Not-In-My-Backyard attitudes (NIMBY)
- Limited Gap Financing
