GROWTH




Since 2010, regional population +250,000 with 70% of growth in Franklin County. Regional population is expected to +725,000 by 2050.

AFFORDABILITY



Since 2020, the median home sale price has increased 68% and the average household spends more than \$12,000 a year on transportation.

OPPORTUNITY GAPS




Opportunity Index (lighter = less






SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLAN




Recommendations include, Increased Connections to:

CORRIDOR ID & MTP





- Utilizing MORPC 2024-2050 MTP development process to identify next two (2) corridors to advance
 - Quantitative and qualitative evaluation
 - Public and stakeholder engagement
 - Coordination with other regional planning activities
 - Draft list by end of 2023
 - Fiscally constrained corridors
 - Corridors for further study




HISTORIC MOBILITY INVESTMENTS

HISTORIC INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENTS





Assumes adding a new **0.5% COTA sales tax** to the existing 0.5% COTA sales tax (likely fall of 2024)

= 1% permanent COTA sales tax

Consistent with investment levels in other regions


Leveraged to secure at least \$650 million in federal funding



MAGNITUDE OF LOCAL FUNDING

Current 2024-2027 TIP:

- \$123M for standalone bike/ped projects
- 27 projects
- 28.1 miles of new multi-use path or bike lanes
- 2.0 miles of new sidewalk





TSI COMMITTEES

Technical Working Groups (TWGs)

- Direct representation for each jurisdiction
- Technical staff (planners, engineers, financial managers)
- Identify and prioritize TSI projects within each geographic quadrant

Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC)


- Subset of TWG members
- Build consensus between quadrants and recommend regional CIB/CIP
- Maintain pipeline of projects for future CIP updates

Leadership Committee (LC)

- Elected/executive level officials
- Approves bylaws, policies, and procedures
- Review and approve recommended TSI CIB/CIP
- Determine overall programmatic strategy with TCC
