INFLATION REDUCTION ACT (IRA)





In August of 2022, Congress passed, and the President signed the Inflation Reduction Act



Provides for \$369 billion dollars in "Energy Security and Climate Change" programs over 10 years



U.S. EPA is receiving a substantial amount of funding for programs



CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT (CPRG) PROGRAM



CPRG Program Goal:

To assist in the development and implementation of strong pollution reduction strategies

Phase I: Planning Grants

• \$250 million to states and metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs)

Phase II: Implementation Grants

• \$4.6 billion to put plans into action




CPRG PHASE I: PLANNING



Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Program | US EPA

- \$250M formula-based grants to states + metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs)
- Purpose: To develop strong pollution (GHG) metrics and pollution reduction strategies
 - Strong emphasis on low-income disadvantaged communities (LIDAC)
- Deliverables:
 - Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) → March 1, 2024
 - Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP) → July 25, 2025
 - Status Report → July 25, 2027



CPRG PHASE II: IMPLEMENTATION



Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Program | US EPA

- \$4.6B competitive grants to put pollution reduction <u>strategies from</u> the <u>Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP)</u> into action
- Eligible entities: local governments, including MPOs / RPOs
 - A regional coalition application
- Deadline = April 1, 2024
- US EPA expected to award 30 115 grants
 - Ranging from \$2 500M
- NOFO scoring criteria
 - Key criteria: impact of GHG reduction measure, LIDAC benefits, scalability



 - Pre-engagement & planning survey
 - Working with the CPRG Strategy Subcommittee
 - Informing all MORPC committees
 - Potential Phase II projects survey
 - → Collecting responses from 12/7 12/31




Pre-engagement survey completed in mid-September

2022 County by County

- Electricity emissions are included at their point of consumption
- The values are preliminary estimates and may change






Preliminary Outcomes

The values provided are preliminary estimates and may change






Net Zero by 2050

Alignment with National Goal

To avoid the worst impacts of climate change, the US has set a goal of net zero by 2050.

To align with this goal, across the nation, we need to:

- Reduce energy and carbon intensity
- Protect, increase, and develop carbon sinks
- Decrease sources of greenhouse gases





REDUCTION MEASURES



- We need to plan for reduction measures that are:
 - Near-term (GHG reductions from 2025-2030) + High-impact
 - Include low-income disadvantaged communities (LIDAC)
 - Implementation-ready and replicable

- Reduction measures sourced from:
 - City of Columbus Climate Action Plan
 - Other initiatives in the region
 - Input received through community engagement

SUMMIT PRELIMINARY RESULTS



Highlights from October's session at the MORPC Summit on Sustainability:

- Priorities with the most votes:
 - Transportation: Increase transit use 25 (5.27%)
 - Commercial: Increase mixed use development 24 (5.06%)
 - Commercial: Increase solar on businesses 21 (4.43%)
 - Industrial: Reduce landfilled organic waste 22 (4.64%)
- Counties represented:
 - Franklin County 438 (92.41%)
 - Licking County 24 (5.06%)
 - Fairfield County 12 (2.53%)
