CORRIDOR ID PROGRAM



The Corridor Identification and Development (Corridor ID) Program is a Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) initiative to reimagine passenger rail planning nationally. It is comprised of three Steps:

Step 1

Selection and Initiation

What: Develop scope, schedule, cost estimate for Step 2

Why: Capacity-building to deliver subsequent Steps

Duration: Likely 6-12 months to complete

Where we are now: \$500,000 federal planning grant award per corridor

Step 2

Route Planning • What: Prepare a Service Development Plan (SDP)

• Why: Detail route, stations, service, capital improvements

• Duration: Likely 1-3 years to complete

Step 3

Project
Development

• What: Preliminary engineering, environmental review

• Why: Prepare projects for design, construction, service

• Duration: Likely <u>1-3 years</u> to complete

UPCOMING WORK



- MORPC will work with our project partners as we move into and through Step 1 of the program
 - Cincinnati-Dayton-Columbus-Cleveland (3C&D)
 - Led by the Ohio Rail Development Commission (ORDC)
 - Chicago-Fort Wayne-Columbus-Pittsburgh (Midwest Connect)
 - Led by the City of Fort Wayne, IN
 - MORPC as a co-sponsor
- Step 2 service development planning not expected to begin until late 2024
 - Initial tasks will focus on reviewing existing conditions and past studies
 - We will have more information on outreach, involvement, and information requests closer to that time
