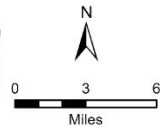
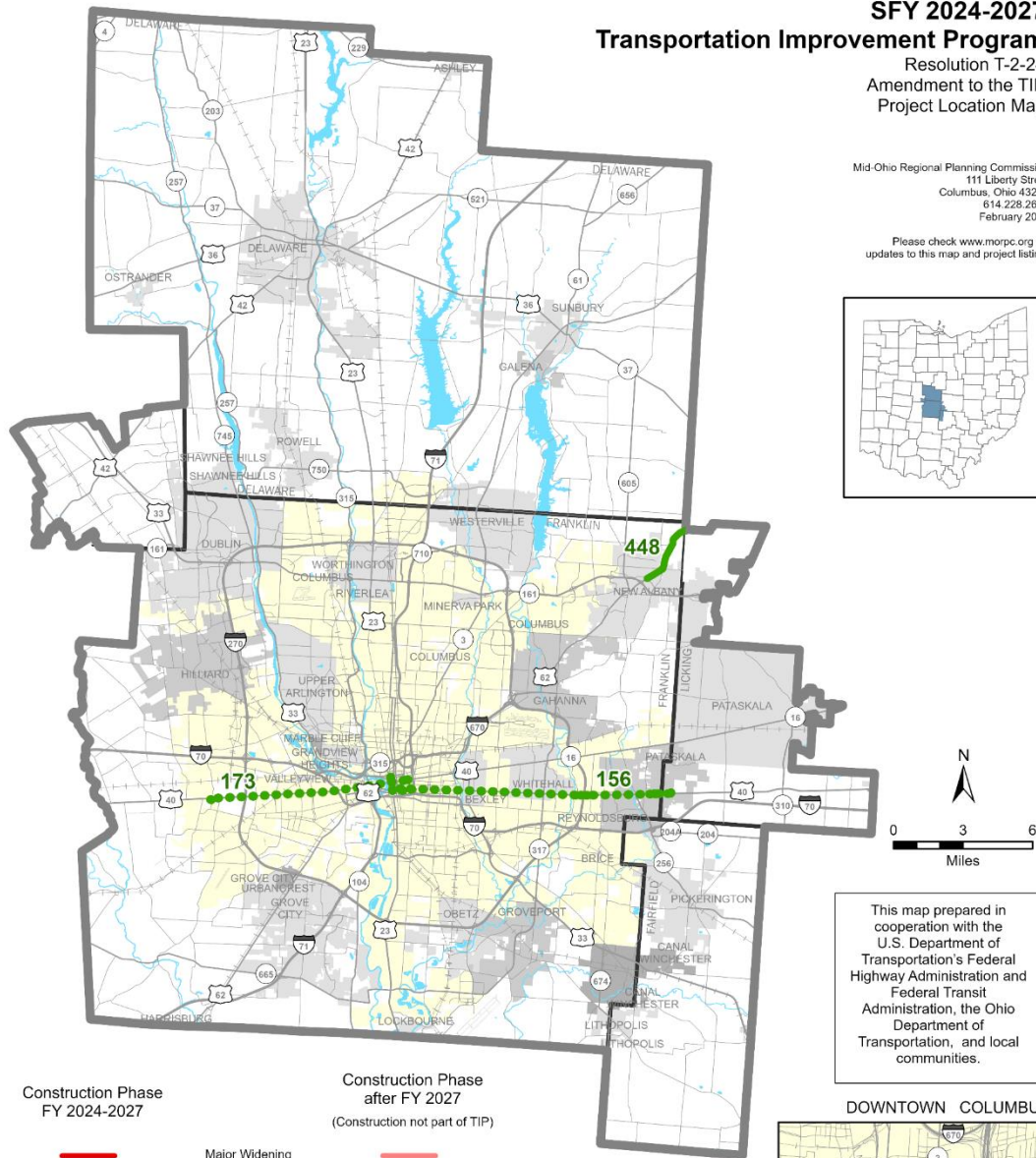
2024-2050 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN
