## MORPC's Commitment to Justice 40

## What is Justice 40?

On January 27, 2021, Presidential Executive Order (E.O. 14008) – Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad was issued.

E.O. 14008, known as Justice40 (J40), mandates at least 40 percent of the overall benefits of certain Federal investments must go to disadvantaged communities that are marginalized, underserved, and overburdened by pollution.

This initiative aims to confront decades of underinvestment by channeling resources into communities that are overburdened by pollution and environmental hazards.
