Strategic Planning	Lead the implementation, revision and updating of the CEDS
Grant Writing & Administration*	Assist communities with their grants before progressing to administration of state and federal grants
Technical Assistance	Planning and implementation assistance, identifying funding resources, providing interagency expertise, and facilitating project conversations with state and federal agencies.
Economic Development Academy*	Engage consultants and practitioners to offer in-person training workshops on a variety of economic development planning topics such as cost benefit analysis, cost and revenue projections, strategy development, land-use planning and more.
Regionwide Freight plan	Develop a regionwide freight plan to support economic development, strengthen regional cohesion around freight movement, and build a sustainable multimodal transportation infrastructure.

Job or Workforce
Training opportunities
are "somewhat
accessible"

Access to education and workforce training are "somewhat equitable"

Attainable housing options, infrastructure readiness, access to job training programs, transportation options (last mile coverage), bike trails, daycare support are initiatives needed to improve the region economically

For community readiness: supportive zoning, updated comprehensive plans, more housing units, utility capacity, site authentication

Uncertainties and challenges - aging population, affordable childcare, infrastructure costs, housing shortage, mixed VC landscape
