**a. MORPC State of the Region**

Dave Dixon informed the Group that registration for the March 21, 2025, State of the Regional event is open, and that members of working groups or committees are eligible for Member pricing for the event. The results of the Leaders Listen Economic Development Survey will be announced at the State of the Region.

**b. MORPC Insights Platform**

Dave introduced the MORPC Insights Platform, which aims to make community-level data more accessible by consolidating various online resources. It features a user-friendly tabbed navigation interface that allows users to select specific counties and communities to find targeted information. Set for a soft launch at the end of February 2025, the platform will gradually include more content and demographic information for different geographies, providing valuable resources for stakeholders.

**3. Working Group Name – *Group***

Members and staff discussed the potential name change for the DEI & Data Working Group due to the term DEI being seen as divisive. Members shared their perspectives, and the Group considered alternative names such as "Data for Social Responsibility" and "Data Access and Opportunity." Members considered the implications of each name and aimed to find a term that would not draw unwanted attention while reflecting the Working Group's mission. Staff will present proposed names to the Regional Data Advisory Committee for approval at their April 1, 2025, meeting.

**4. Data Day Sessions Debrief – *Group***

Dave thanked the Group for their participation in the February 5 Data Day sessions. Yan Liu and Member Masood provided recaps of their sessions, highlighting the engagement and feedback from attendees. Member Miller shared positive feedback on the overall event and the opening plenary.

**5. Using Data to Promote Healthy Communities – *Group***

Dave presented a grant opportunity from the Urban Institute for using data to promote healthy communities. Member Miller suggested focusing on low-stress routes to green

spaces and sidewalk conditions. The Group discussed the potential for using data to improve active transportation and green space access, and the tools available for analyzing walkability and Bikeability, including the active transportation network tool. Applying for this grant would highlight the issue of equitable access to green spaces and the challenges of prioritizing projects.

Members and staff considered focusing the next Working Group Initiative on using data to improve active transportation and green space access, and discussed the feasibility of applying for the "Using Data to Promote Healthy Communities" grant.

The response deadline for the grant is March 18, 2025.

The program is **calling for new proposals, due March 18, 2025**, and plans to fund 30 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(4) nonprofits working in housing, transportation, community safety, climate and environment, the built environment, and other conditions in a place.

Each grantee will receive \$50,000 to cover project implementation, peer learning opportunities, and technical assistance from the Urban Institute on data, policy, and community engagement.
