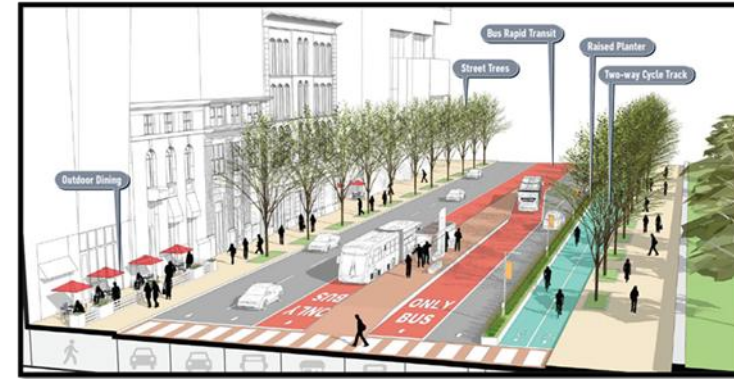

MORPC Attributable Funds

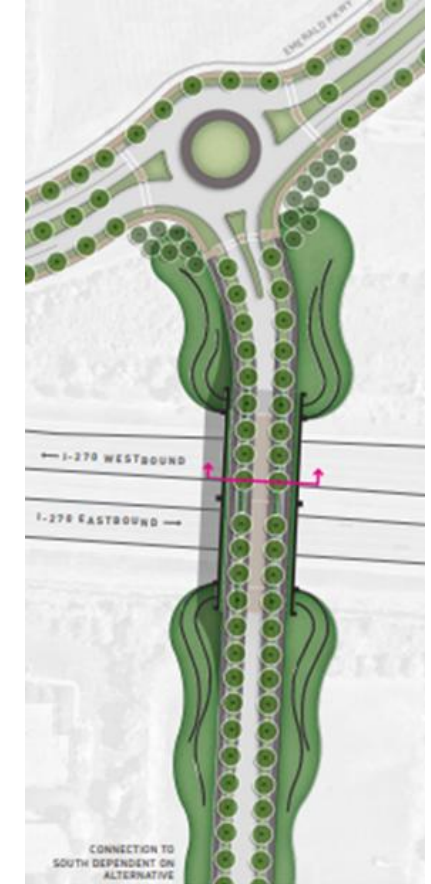
- T-3-25 approves \$52 million in new funding commitments across seven projects and approves \$23 million in increased funding for outstanding commitments.

New funding commitments

- **Columbus** – Trabue Rd at Walcutt Rd - **\$7.4 M**
- **Columbus** – East Broad Capital trail - **\$9.3 M**
- **Dublin** – The Emerald Connector - **\$4.5 M**
- **Grove City** – Southwest Regional Medical and Innovation Gateway Overpass - **\$2.6 M**
- **Franklin County** – Cooke Rd Phase 2 - **\$9.2 M**
- **COTA** – E Main BRT - **\$14.4 M**
- **Columbus** – Big Walnut Trail (Cherrybottom Park to Morse Rd) - **\$4.7 M**

TRAC Funding

- Staff shared draft funding recommendations for the 2024 TRAC funding round.
- TRAC will vote on these funding recommendations on March 26, which will be followed by a public comment period.
- Final vote on TRAC funding on April 23
- Recommended \$90.8 million in funding of the \$285.8 million requested

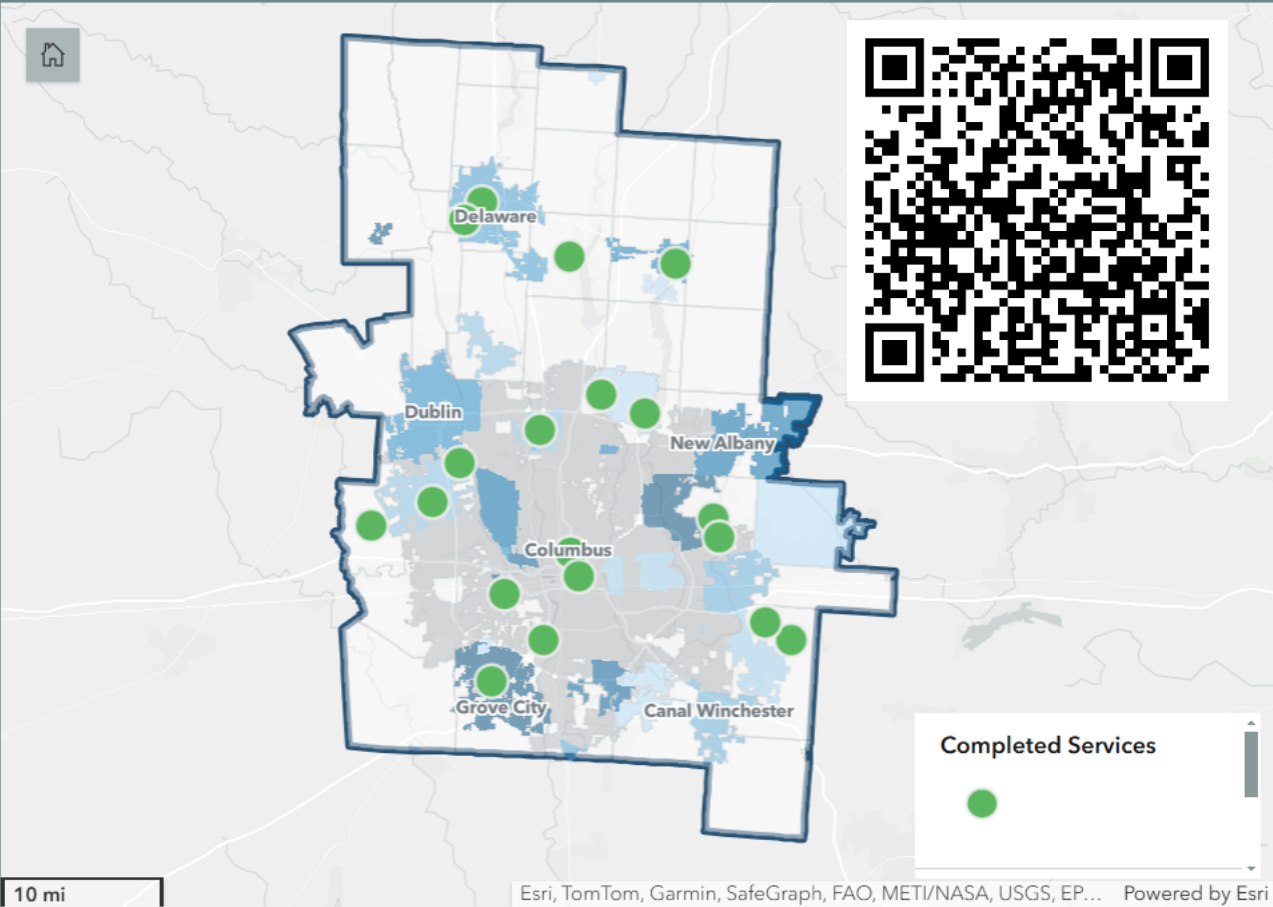

City of Sunbury Trail Access & Connectivity (Cycle Two, 2022)

Overview:

The City of Sunbury requested MORPC technical assistance to identify opportunities to bridge the gaps in the Ohio-to-Erie (OTE) Trail and better connect Sunbury neighborhoods to the OTE Trail.

MORPC worked with the City of Sunbury to document existing conditions, compile all concurrent plans and development activities, and identify opportunities for further assessment with the help of key stakeholders. The team analyzed the existing and proposed active transportation network and identified opportunities to improve access to the OTE Trail, resulting in recommendations for next steps that included roadway improvements, crossings and intersection enhancements, and new trail connections.
