



#### **2024 END OF SEASON REPORT**




**March 5 –** Release date; report available at: morpc.org/airquality

**3 Alerts issued -** down from 11 alerts last year; ozone was the primary pollutant of concern on all 3 days

Majority of days (72%) in "Good" category - 27% in Moderate, <1% in "Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups" or Alert-level days


**Highest PM 2.5 day observed in October -** result of stagnant weather and drought conditions

**EPA's new stricter PM standard enacted May 6, 2024 -** even with the tougher standard, Central OH was and will continue to be in attainment with this federal standard

"Community Led Enhanced Air Quality Network" (CLEAN) – Co-led by Franklin Public Health and MORPC

**Deployed 36 PurpleAir sensors** into the community to better understand neighborhood-level pollution

Working with consultant, Ramboll, on mapping and understanding pollution sources
