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### 2026 - 2027 CORPO Dedicated Funds Program

CORPO will solicit applications for the 2026 – 2027 CORPO Dedicated Funds program this summer. The two-year cycle will have funds available for member-selected, eligible transportation projects within CORPO member counties. Below is the adopted schedule for the 2026 – 2027 program. ## **May CORPO Committee Meeting Recap**

The CORPO Committee met on May 5. See the recap of the Committee action items below.

- ❖ Resolution 1 25 adopted the 2026 CORPO Planning Work Program.
- ❖ Resolution 2 25 adopted the new CORPO Committee Bylaws, which will now be reviewed by the MORPC legal team and then go for adoption by the Commission.
- ❖ Resolution 3 25 approved the 2026 2029 CORPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).
- ❖ Resolution 4 25 approved requested budget increases for two projects that received CORPO Dedicated Funds awards.
- ❖ Resolution 5 25 approved the Policies for Managing CORPO Dedicated Funds for the 2026 2027 funding cycle.



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#### **Funding Applications and Opportunities**

CORPO Staff are available to assist with funding applications and technical assistance.

- ★ Township Safety Sign Program, ODOT- Up to \$50K in signs, posts, and hardware to improve the safety of their roadways based on previous 5 years crash history. Any township which has not previously been funded is eligible to apply. A reminder will be emailed to eligible CORPO townships. The deadline to apply is June 6.
- ❖ Small City Program, ODOT- This program provides federal funds to small cities with populations from 5,000 to 24,999 that are not located within a MPO's boundaries. This program may be used for any road, safety, or signal project on the Federal-aid system, with a project funding limit of \$2 million per project. Eligible cities in CORPO are Circleville, London, and Mt. Vernon. The deadline to apply is June 15.
- Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A), USDOT- 2 types of grants available- Planning & Demonstration and Implementation. Planning & Demonstration funds action plans, as well as supplemental planning activities and demonstration activities in support of an action plan. Implementation grants fund projects to implement actions identified in a safety action plan. Reference the CORPO Safety Action here. The application deadline is June 26.
- ❖ Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Abbreviated Safety Application, ODOT- This program is intended to fund potentially less complex safety improvements quickly. Eligible projects need to be simple (under \$500,000 and must be constructed within 2 years), utilize proven safety countermeasures, and be in a location with 3 crashes per year. Applications are due for review 4 times per year and the next window closes June 30.
