MORPC Updates

Legislative

Kyle Probert provided a concise overview of the federal and state legislative landscape. Congress finalized the FY24 budget, avoiding a shutdown, and is now preparing for FY25. The deadline for Senate-directed spending requests has passed, but House deadlines remain pending. At the state level, April 8 is the deadline for Senate capital budget submissions. Kyle also highlighted political shifts from the recent primary election, which may impact House leadership. Additionally, he celebrated the \$42 million USDOT Reconnecting Communities grant awarded to COTA for the LinkUS West Broad Street Connector, a major infrastructure project with Complete Streets implications.

LinkUS

Zach Sunderland, COTA, expanded on the LinkUS initiative, emphasizing the \$42 million federal grant and an additional \$15 million from ODOT TRAC for the West Broad Corridor. He detailed the structure of the Transit Supportive Infrastructure (TSI) planning process, which includes leadership, technical, and working group committees. The TSI initiative is tied to a proposed sales tax increase, with 27.5% allocated to infrastructure like sidewalks and bikeways. Projects are being prioritized by quadrant within the COTA service area, with a goal of finalizing a five-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) by summer. Public engagement and feasibility studies for 20 projects are also underway, led by Franklin County Engineers.

Working Group and Committee Updates

Melinda Vonstein shared upcoming meeting dates for various working groups: Trail Development (April 18), Trail Towns (April 19), and Mapping Natural Assets (TBD). She noted significant summer trail closures and the need for coordinated communication. She also introduced Luke Messinger as the new CEO of RAPID 5, and discussed MORPC's support for RAPID 5 through mapping and technical assistance.

<u>Trail Development Working Group</u>

Melinda reported that the Trail Development Working Group is focused on expanding the Regional Trail Vision to MORPC's full 15-county area. Melinda proposed inviting one representative from each county to the Working Group and considering Board expansion to reflect the broader footprint.

Trail Towns Working Group and the Wayfinding Strategy

Melinda reported that the Trail Towns Working Group will review the finalized Wayfinding Strategy in April. Jesse Sampson is researching best practices for Trail Town websites and exploring ESRI tools like Story Maps and Dashboards to enhance user experience. The Strategy emphasizes cohesive signage while preserving local branding. Melinda also noted that a RAISE Application was recently submitted for trail town enhancements in three communities and regional bikeway expansion.

<u>Trail Detours & Closures Working Group</u>

MORPC is seeking Members to help develop clear, safe detour messaging.

Mapping Natural Assets Working Group

Melinda reported that the project to assess environmental data along watersheds is launching in April.

Celebrate Trails Day

Celebrate Trails Day is scheduled for April 27. The Central Ohio Greenways event, in partnership with Green Columbus, is the largest in the country. Organizations are encouraged to participate by hosting tables or providing speakers.

Community Engagement – Hellbranch Trail

Member Schamp discussed a community engagement effort in Hilliard regarding the Hellbranch Trail. A resurfacing project may allow for improved cyclist accommodations. A short survey is available via COG's social media and is open through the following Friday.
