The Pickaway County Transportation Improvements project includes intersection and interchange improvements in several key commercial corridors. The project includes construction of two roundabouts on SR 762, an interchange at SR 762 and US 23, and a bypass around the Village of South Bloomfield on US 23. The project relieves development-related congestion and improves safety.

Improvement/Phase	Description	Estimated Cost
US HWY 23/SR 762 Interchange	Construct interchange at US 23 and SR 762 (Duvall Road)	\$17 million
SR 762/Duvall Rd. roundabout	New roundabout at intersection of SR 762 and Duval Road to address growing congestion related to development.	\$3-5 million
US HWY 23 South Bloomfield bypass	Bypass around the Village of South Bloomfield to preserve the integrity of the US 23 Corridor and alleviate a worsening "bottleneck" for commuters.	\$60 million
SR 762/Rickenbacker Parkway roundabout	New roundabout at intersection of SR 762 and Rickenbacker Parkway to address growing congestion related to development.	\$3-5 million
