Background

The Regional Data Advisory Committee (RDAC) was created in 2016, with a mission to advance data policies and strategic actions to increase access to open data in Central Ohio. In 2018, the RDAC created its Regional Data Agenda to focus their work on a more short-term planning horizon. There are five Goals, 21 Objectives, and 61 Action Items in the Regional Data Agenda. RDAC members identified four priority projects to work on initially, one of which is to establish a Regional Data User Group. Specifically, the Regional Data Agenda states: Goal 1: In its role as a convener and facilitator, MORPC will foster collaboration among local governments, partners, and stakeholders to enhance the use of data in Central Ohio. Objective 1.1: Convene meetings of local government staff responsible for creating and maintaining the region's data resources. Action item 1.1.4: Support the creation of a new Central Ohio data user group.

Establish Working Group Scope, Timeline, & Meeting Schedule Scope

Define the purpose and value of the user group to various stakeholders in the region.

- Identify gaps to be filled in
- Gain information about data
- Discover what data people are working on
- Create an opportunity for idea sharing
- Increase data competency
- Develop best practices
- Foster the ability to channel information and feedback from actual data users Determine the hosting structure of the user group.
- MORPC will host the User Group meetings.

Compile a list of organizations and specific organizational roles or individuals to invite to the user group.

- Explore a cross-section of different industries, subject matter, and geography
- Invite interested Central Ohio GIS User Group (COGUG) members
- Consider experts in specific data types:
 - drug and opioid crisis
 - school scores/ratings
 - migration patterns for minority populations
- Engage users with different levels of sophistication for cross pollination between entry level users and super users.

<u>Identify an initial meeting format and schedule that best enhances the user group's regional</u> value.

• To be discussed at a later meeting, with a goal of the User Group meetings starting in Q1 2020.

<u>Create and implement a communication plan to ensure a successful launch of the user group.</u>

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REGIONAL DATA USER GROUP WORKING GROUP

Action Plan

This working group is established in support of the Regional Data Advisory Committee's goal that MORPC foster collaboration among local governments, partners, and stakeholders to enhance the use of data in Central Ohio.
