Welcome – Karen Angelou

Chair Karen Angelou called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m. Chair Angelou recognized Kim Maggard and Joe Stefanov for articles in the Columbus CEO magazine.

Consent Agenda

Joe Stefanov made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, second by Nancy White; motion passed.

Executive Director's Report – William Murdock

William Murdock echoed Chair Angelou's congratulations to Mayor Maggard and Mr. Stefanov. Mr. Murdock announced MORPC's insight2050 program will be receiving an award from Ohio APA in October.

Typically, Mr. Murdock gives a diversity and inclusion update in September. The update is being postponed until October. We are finalizing our strategy which will be ready in October.

Mr. Murdock and Shawn Hufstedler gave a building update. The lease is locked down and we are moving forward. MORPC is working with architects and doing detailed work before seeing drawings. The architects surveyed MORPC Team Members; over 70 percent responded to the survey. Five internal committees are helping guide the work: accessibility, IT, branding, furniture, and sustainability. We anticipate the lower level being ready by the second quarter or mid-year of next year.

Several thousand people participated in The Big Table event last week. MORPC Team Members who hosted a Big Table include Aaron Schill, Stephen Patchan, Brandi Whetstone, Bernice Cage, and Robert Williams. MORPC Team Members who participated in a Big Table include Shawn Hufstedler (M+A Architects), Bernice Cage (Columbus Chamber of Commerce), Kerstin Carr (Grange Audubon Center), and Patty Olmsted (National Veterans Memorial and Museum).

The entire MORPC staff participated in implicit bias training. The training, led by Courtnee Carrigan, looked at making people aware of their own biases. We are looking at 2020 diversity training for staff.

Twenty MORPC Team Members recently were Certified as Tourism Ambassadors (CTA). Tourism is the number one business in the State of Ohio. The certification training focused on regional amenities. Since MORPC employees work throughout the region, we provided training for them to be better ambassadors for the region.

The RFQ for Strategic Planning Facilitation is being released today.

The Annual Salary & Fringe Benefit Survey will be released this week. Mr. Murdock thanked the Executive Committee communities for participating. A record 30 communities participated this year. Categories were added this year based on feedback from last year.

Mr. Murdock gave an update on the insight2050 Corridor Concepts. Four of the five corridors studied have either met or begun discussions. The Parsons to Rickenbacker corridor met last week. The East Main corridor has met. The Cleveland Avenue corridor has begun discussions. The Olentangy NW corridor is the fastest moving corridor. Jennifer Gallagher reported the corridor issued an RFP for creating a framework around making sure we're choosing second and third corridors appropriately and that we have the right corridor alignment. Ohio State has been a huge partner and helping find funding for the corridor mobility study. Ms. Gallagher anticipates the study will take a year. Mr. Murdock shared that MORPC is trying to have entities put together an employer group to scan other regions where this may be needed.

Over 100 people participated in the three MORPC Rural Workshops held over the summer. MORPC Team Members talked about what MORPC does, listened for area needs, discussed workforce development and helped make connections. MORPC partnered with Ohio University's Government School. Mr. Murdock thanked Eileen Leuby for putting the workshops together.

The Summit on Sustainability is October 11. This year's theme is resiliency. Speakers have been announced and breakout sessions will be announced next week. Registration is open through Sunday, September 29 at www.morpc.org/summit.

The Columbus region has now achieved attainment status as the first in the nation to meet the new ozone standard. Being in compliance helps ease asthma as well as promotes economic development. There are only a few major regions in the country in ozone attainment.

Regional Policy Roundtable Update – Joe Garrity

Over the past month MORPC Team Members have been meeting with legislators at the Statehouse who serve on the Road to Ohio's Future Committee. This committee was established through the state transportation budget and is tasked with finding long-term funding mechanisms for transportation before the end of 2020. A few weeks ago, we met with Rep. Cross and Rep. Greenspan and shared the 19 recommendations the leadership strategy group developed last year. We focused specifically on indexing the motor fuel tax to inflation, finding capital dollars for rural or regional planning organizations and eventually transitioning from a motor fuel tax to a vehicle miles traveled funding service long term. Next week we meet with Sen. McColly, committee co-chair.

We continue to monitor HB 228, the imminent domain bill regarding trails.

The Regional Policy Roundtable is convening a meeting on HB 163 which creates a process of withholding local government funds to municipal corporations who have certain standards or water/sewer assistance practices with their neighboring political subdivisions. MORPC is not taking a stance on the bill. The meeting is to educate members on the bill's economic impact.

Regional Data Advisory Committee – Aaron Schill

The Regional Data Advisory Committee (RDAC) is meeting later this month. The RDAC has kicked-off four working groups for priority projects:

- Develop a regional data users group
- Sustainability dashboard (combined with the Sustainability Advisory Committee)
- Data governance and policy needs for local governments
- Develop strategies for an interconnected municipal fiber network for the region

Mayor Kneeland is terming off as chair at the end of the year. He laid a great foundation in getting the RDAC moving. We need to be thoughtful about who will fill the role. The chair needs to be a commission member. Mr. Schill is seeking recommendations from the Executive Committee.

Preparing for the census continues by doing work on the technical side to help communities. The Local Government Working Group meets next week. Approximately 12 communities are participating but we would love to have more. Mr. Schill will give an update at the Commission meeting. The working group is looking at two opportunities to provide support for local governments: provide talking points and information for elected officials and identify ways local governments can get the word out.

Central Ohio Rural Planning Organization

MORPC Team Members are taking information from the Rural Workshops held this summer and looking for grant opportunities. ODOT mentioned earlier this year they may have additional dollars for CORPO planning. Team Members are using information from the workshops to mold a package. Knox County asked MORPC to give a presentation on SmartColumbus. Each ODOT District is participating in rural consultations for the State Transportation Improvement Program. MORPC is going out with ODOT to the CORPO counties for their rural consultations.

Transportation Policy Committee Update – Thea Walsh

Eight Central Ohio TRAC applications in MORPC's MPO area and one application in Licking County's MPO area were submitted. MORPC received 95 comments on the applications in their MPO. There is big interest in the Big Walnut project. The proposal for that project is not asking for money. MORPC asked TRAC to consider it for future years but did not ask for funding this year. Thea Walsh is presenting the following priorities to TRAC next week:

- Two projects for the Far East Freeway
- Union County, Post Road which MORPC has attributable funds in
- Delaware Point which MORPC has attributable funds in
- US 33/Pickerington Road
- I-71/Stringtown Road
- I-270/US 23 on the southside

The Third Street Mobility Pilot with the City of Columbus and COTA has wrapped up. The pilot took place the end of July/early August between Gay and Mound Streets with a focused effort around bicycling. It included a survey and a focus group effort. The next pilot may happen this fall. Key findings from the pilot include:

- People are uncomfortable with right turns and enforcement in the area
- People like the physical barrier
- People are concerned with the proximity of buses and breathing

Most feedback was positive. COTA had a 25% on-time performance improvement.

Government Technology Magazine's Special Districts Program recently issued a call for nominations for special awards. MORPC nominated the Special Improvement District for their collaboration on the C-pass program with MORPC and COTA. They won their award and will be traveling to Chicago to accept the award on September 18. During its first year, the C-pass program has had over a million rides, increased inbound/outbound rush hour traffic for COTA, registered 15,000 workers, and saw an increase in ridership from five to fifteen percent.

Proposed Resolution 15-19: "Recognizing September 2019 as Safe Driving Awareness Month" – Stephen Patchan

Our region has seen an increase in crashes and fatalities and is outpacing the state averages. This resolution promotes what MORPC does and encourages our members to partner with us in encouraging safe driving. We are encouraging members to adopt their own safety resolutions and drafting templates for distracted driving and complete streets policies that members can tailor for their communities for adoption.

Ohio's distracted driving law is not a primary offense. ODOT has a version of Vision Zero, but we could scale it down to a region. Stephen Patchan will send information to the Executive Committee on the Vision Zero program which is a vision of zero fatalities.

Matt Greeson made a motion to approve Resolution 15-19, second by Kim Maggard; motion passed.

Residential Services Update – Robert Williams

Robert Williams provided a [Residential Services Update](#). MORPC's Residential Services Team is focusing on a plan for long term growth and sustainability to meet the current challenges.

Efforts the department is working on to overcome obstacles include:

- Increase outreach through City/Government/Community Organizations, Emerging Communities, and Community Events.
- Develop key partnerships with other organizations that focus on affordable housing.
- Expand marketing through varied media and print resources. Making certain to reach diverse communities through print and audio resources.
- Perform an intake study to develop best practices.
- Measure outcomes.

Draft Commission Agenda

The Executive Committee reviewed the draft September 12, 2019 Commission Meeting Agenda.

SUBJECT: Proposed Resolution 16-19: **“Establishing population estimates as a basis for 2020 annual participation fees to be assessed members”**

The attached resolution provides population estimates for January 1, 2020 for the purpose of assessing participation fees from member jurisdictions. Six new members (City of Bellefontaine, Fairfield County, Logan County, Morrow County, Truro Township, Washington Township [Delaware, Franklin, and Union counties]) were added to MORPC in 2019. The member participation fees (“dues”) are calculated using the rates adopted in Resolution 10-19.

Included with the proposed resolution is a detailed list of the 2020 population estimates, member dues, and Commission representation for each MORPC member. Dues and Commission representation information from the prior year and population information for the past two years are included for each member in the detailed list for reference.

After consultation with the Delaware County Regional Planning Commission, MORPC decided to use that organization’s population estimates for all MORPC member communities located entirely within Delaware County.

RESOLUTION 16-19

“Establishing population estimates as a basis for 2020 annual participation fees to be assessed members”

WHEREAS, MORPC staff has developed January 1, 2020 population estimates to provide a basis for local dues assessments, as per the Articles of Agreement; and

WHEREAS, 2020 participation fees are assessed at a rate of \$0.575 per capita for members within the federally declared Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Study Area boundaries of MORPC, \$0.48 per capita for members within the Central Ohio Rural Planning Organization (CORPO) boundaries, and \$0.38 for members not located within the MPO or CORPO areas, in accordance with Resolution 10-19; and

WHEREAS, \$0.07 per capita is earmarked exclusively for the MORPC building/reserve, in accordance with Resolution 10-19; and

WHEREAS, Attachment 1 sets forth the population and dues assessments for MORPC members; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MID-OHIO REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION:

- Section 1. That the January 1, 2020 population estimates, as documented in the Attachment, are hereby adopted for the purpose of assessing 2020 participation fees, as listed in the Attachment.
- Section 2. That the executive director is authorized to take such other action and execute and deliver such other documents as, acting with the advice of legal counsel, he shall deem necessary and appropriate to carry out the intent of this resolution.
- Section 3. That this Commission finds and determines that all formal deliberations and actions of this Commission concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in open meetings of this Commission.
