I have an email out to Kelsey Finch with the Future of Privacy Forum / Civil Data Privacy Leaders Network CDPLN, as she is spearheading an effort there to pull together an open resource library for CDPLN members to contribute to nationwide. I have asked about their timeline and whether they have defined their "buckets" to date.

In addition, I have gone through and indexed the resources we have in SharePoint in the attached .xls pivot table, coding them by sample metadata to give us a since of where we have ample (or lacking) domain/sub-domain coverage.
