

Virtual Meeting Guidance for Local Governments and Political Subdivisions

Overview

To help support local governments and political subdivisions in the delivery of virtual public/open meetings, the Ohio Department of Administrative Services leveraged its' research and security resources to provide guidance that will assist in making informed decisions. Please note that the State of Ohio does not recommend any particular product or vendor, the information contained within this document is provided only to identify the various tools and possible considerations for selection.

Available State of Ohio Services - Cooperative Purchasing Program

The State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program does allow local governments and public entities access to a variety of goods and services from participating State contracts. If an entity is interested in pursuing and acquiring goods and services from the State of Ohio Master Service Agreement Contract as it relates to Microsoft O365 subscription-based services, they will need to acquire their own pricing through an authorized Microsoft Reseller to procure licensing and support.
