ADAMH served 135,745 people in 2019 - a 41% increase in people served from 2017 to 2019



- Approximately 85% of ADAMH consumers live below the federal poverty level
- Average age of ADAMH consumer is 34
- 45% of ADAMH consumers are women
- 56% of consumers self-identify as white
- 38% identify as Black or African

Mental health concerns are increasing



For every 100 American adults, **34** show symptoms of **anxiety**, **depression**, or **both**

20 show symptoms of both anxiety and depression

4 show symptoms of depression alone

10 show symptoms of **anxiety** alone


