








Distribution of Personal Trips Passing Through the I-70/71 Overlap in Ohio State Area











Distribution of Personal Trips Passing Through the I-70/71 Overlap in 15 County Area



Distribution of Commercial Trips Passing Through the I-70/71 Overlap in Ohio State Area




