Chair Milam reported that the draft goals and objectives of the Regional Sustainability Agenda (RSA) have been presented for review to this Subcommittee, the Sustainability Advisory Committee, and to Sustainable2050 members.

Equity Resource Document – Dr. Jason Reece, OSU Knowlton School

Dr. Reece reported that the focus of the Resource Guide is to provide a series of data sources, best practices and research-based framing of how to approach social equity concerns.

The guide will include the full details of:

- Potential metrics and other data considerations specifically for the equity objectives.
- Examples of peer (best practice) data tools to analyze equity elements.
- Strategies and best practices to foster robust engagement with equity communities.
- Strategies to understand social equity concerns across the urban, suburban, and rural landscapes.
- Examples of best practices (planning and policy) for integrating equity and sustainability.
- Inventory of additional resource tools (data, best practices).

Strategies: Review Major Themes From Survey

Brandi Whetstone reported that staff will ensure that the RSA strategies will align with existing MORPC plans and programs, including existing strategies members have been working toward, primarily activities eligible for Sustainable2050 certification. A final goal is to include an equity-focused strategy for each objective.

Member Özbilen suggested prioritizing underserved communities when possible. Staff noted that MORPC could encourage sustainable2050 members to do so. Dr. Reece added that OSU Kirwan has an analytical tool that may assist in identifying risk. This tool will be included in the Resource Guide.

Member Plouck noted that zoning changes could encourage the use of green materials in residential housing. Members agreed that the support would come from municipal code changes. Chair Milam and Member Plouck will communicate with Brandi after the meeting.

Approach for Metrics, Data, and Setting Targets

Liz Whelan reported that the process of creating the metrics will be taking the qualitative statements and review the data that is available, valuable, and possible to measure. Staff will identify which data sources can be tracked over time and can also be compared to similar data from other regions.

Staff will work up proposed metrics to present to the Subcommittee at their February meeting.

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2021 Work Plan and Next Steps

The intended timeline for completion and adoption of the RSA is:

- In February:
- Review/finalize Equity Resource Document from Dr. Reece
- Finalize the stakeholder input process by early March by means of a survey to key stakeholder groups
- Hold an informational presentation for Stakeholders in late February/early March

The February 24 Subcommittee meeting will focus on data, metrics, and methodology

In March:

• Complete the stakeholder input process.

The March 30 Subcommittee meeting will focus on finalizing the RSA.

In April:

• Complete the final revision of the RSA

On April 17 the Subcommittee will present the RSA to the Sustainability Advisory Committee for adoption.
