Description & overview

In order to prevent housing displacement, it is critical to understand where it may be likely to happen in the future - the earlier the intervention in these areas, the greater likelihood of success. Some communities have developed robust data infrastructure to get in front of these issues, often leveraging mapping technology to learn from historic incidences of housing displacement or neighborhood change and to understand where neighborhoods are experiencing pressures or other indicators of displacement risk today. This data can be used to inform planning and strategic deployment of preservation resources (among other interventions). This kind of analysis may be incorporated into a preservation early warning system or established separately.

Scaling this action could involve updating the analysis on a regular basis (through MORPC or another regional organization with data and research capacity). The results of this analysis may be used to develop local and regional anti-displacement actions failored to the displacement risk level and submarket conditions where the action would be implemented.

Regional Examples

To inform the Regional Housing Strategy, the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission has completed a displacement risk analysis for every Census Tract within the 7-county study area. This analysis considers economic vulnerability, demographic change, and housing prices to understand where neighborhoods may be at risk and what type of displacement risk residents may be facing. The methods were built upon work completed by the City of Portland in 2018.





CURRENT POPULATION IN CENTRAL OHIO COMMUNITIES

MORPC produces annual estimates of the population and housing units for cities, villages, townships, and counties in Central Ohio. Our estimates are based on broad changes in the population at the county level (using administrative records on births, deaths, and migration), as well as housing activity at the local level (using building permit data collected from 50 permitting agencies throughout the region).


