The Group continues to work through each policy within HB 96, for understanding, sharing the implementation timeline, and objectives for the local organizations. Working Group Members Mark Bell, Adjutant General's Department of Ohio, and Duane Powell, City of Hilliard, have provided informational data to be shared by MORPC leadership at regular regional member visits.
 - **Data Day Working Group** – *Jordan Inskeep*

The Working Group and MORPC staff have discussed the possibility of transitioning from a working group model toward developing a group of Data Day Champions. A Data Day Champion is an individual who volunteers to distribute information and promote Data Day. Materials and information would be shared asynchronously with Champions to promote Data Day. We are hoping to enlist 6-10 Champions initially.

Tasks for champions would include:

- Suggest and recruit keynote speakers
- Suggest and recruit sponsorships
- Promote and distribute Call for Session Proposals
- Promote the event

Do these tasks seem reasonable to request from Champions? What materials do you think you would need to promote Data Day (i.e. email templates, PowerPoint slides, event details)?

- **Data for Access & Opportunity Working Group – *Dave Dixon***
In support of CURA's multimodal accessibility analysis for the Connect project, the Group has recommended analyzing park and trail accessibility for use cases including walking, biking, and transit in ten-minute intervals from ten to forty minutes, and a comparison made between overall accessibility in the area and for areas deemed to be historically marginalized or disadvantaged per MORPC's Community Impact Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) methods.
 - If you are interested in the project results, please let staff know and we can invite you to the next Working Group meeting or share a recording.
 - How might these results affect how your community plans? What other types of analyses conducted with this method would you find valuable?
- **Regional Data Agenda Update Working Group – *Dave Dixon***
The RDA Working Group has developed a working draft of the 2026–2028 Regional Data Agenda for RDR Member review, representing a significant overhaul of the previous agenda. Major updates include added context about RDR and the Agenda's purpose, a new umbrella goal of "Data & Analytics Collaboration," and four revised pillars: Promote Reliable Trusted Data, Expand Education, Bolster Support, and Increase Digital Representation & Opportunity. The draft also recommends grounding data activities in core focus areas—such as Transportation & Mobility and Housing & Community Development—while acknowledging overlap with other member interests without formally designating them as focus areas.
